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In the fall of 2020, ASCA conducted a province-wide survey of parents with children in the K-12 education system in Alberta to learn, directly from them, their experiences of school 're-entry' during the Covid-19 pandemic. ASCA was grateful to receive over 21,000 complete survey responses, as parents felt compelled to share their valuable perspectives.

As the challenging and often tumultuous 2020-2021 school year was drawing to close, ASCA was again eager to learn directly from parents. The Parent Pandemic Pulse 2 (PPP2) survey was designed to compare responses on similar questions as the previous survey, as well as understand current perspectives and future hopes and concerns through new questions.

A very evident 'current perspective' gained from the PPP2 Survey is that parents are "done". Although significantly fewer parents attempted (673) or completed (508) PPP2, those parents provided mindful responses sharing their current thoughts, past experiences, and aspirations for the 2021-2022 school year.

As we did with the responses from the first Parent Pandemic Pulse survey, ASCA will utilize the information gathered in PPP2 to relay parents' experiences related to the 2020-2021 school year. ASCA will also convey to Alberta's Education Ministry, partners, and stakeholders, what parents would like to experience in this next school year, as Alberta's students, teachers and families embark upon the eagerly anticipated journey of recovery from Covid-19.



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


### 1.Do you have at least one child in Alberta's kindergarten to grade 12 (K-12) schools?


#### 2.How are you feeling?


### 3. How challenging was it for your child(ren) to learn this year (face to face or online)?














# 32.Is the school council at your child's school an Alberta School Councils' Association Member?


# 33.Do you keep in contact with the school council at your child's school?




## 35.Do you live in an Alberta city, town or rural area?
